The Road to Revitalize Solutions

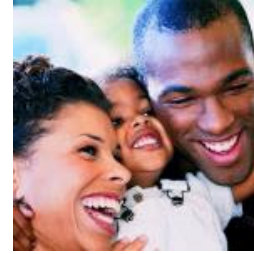
